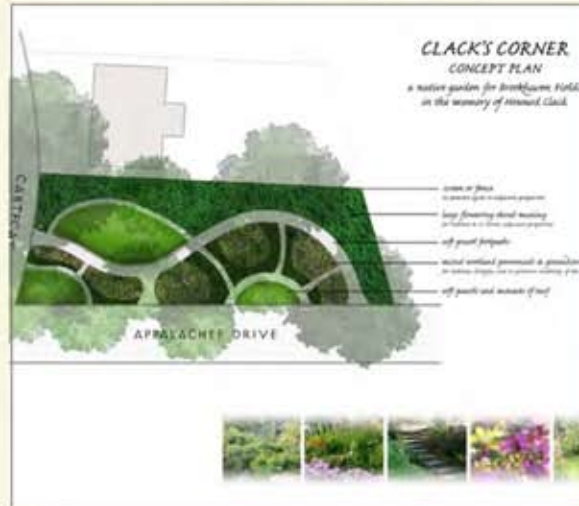
Great people, of course... architecture and gardens. Quality services and rare finds. Good places to eat.

..a place to meet people with my coffee for a break in the middle of the workday. Or maybe take a lunch. Sometimes I may want to sit alone...mostly I would like to sit on a bench or stone wall and visit with someone, or have a game of checkers or cards on a small stone table between 2 chairs.

I would like it to be a place where we can stop and bump into our neighbors, talk for a few minutes, meet their children and dogs... trade news.

The book club could meet there in nice weather.

I'd like a bench or low wall where we can sit in the shade; native flowers that draw butterflies; maybe a bird house and a bird feeder that we'd be

willing to fill sometimes if others will help out too.

Howard Clack was born in this house and lived here until his death in 2006. He was often seen walking or heard playing the piano. This park is the fulfillment of his wish for it to be a public greenspace. DeKalb County purchased the property to be used as a park, however, the park must be designed, installed and maintained with private funds. The Clack Family has made a generous \$10,000 contribution to the park in Howard's memory. BFCA has committed \$1000 for installation, in addition to overseeing the maintenance. Park Pride is the fiscal partner for the project.
